		· anthrax - during the last 20 days in the premises;	
II.2.	The animals were not subjected to the exposure of natural or synthetic estrogenic, hormonal substances and thyreostatics.		
II.3.	Animals have been in the place of origin since birth or not less than 6 months. The exported animals were kept for 21 days in quarantine under the supervision of the Official State Veterinarian of the exporting country (Place and date of quarantine) and the representative of the State Veterinary Service of the Russian Federation and during this period they were subjected to individual clinical examination with daily thermometry, had no contacts with other animals, were tested in official laboratory by the methods, approved in the EU Member State, with negative results (indicate the name of the laboratory, date and method of testing) for:
