	II.1.	Sheep and goats exported into the Russian Federation are clinically healthy, were born and raised in the EU, are not pregnant, are not vaccinated against brucellosis (<i>Brucella melitensis</i>) and are originated from premises and administrative territories:(1)	
	II.1.1.	that are officially free from the following contagious diseases:	
	·	Scrapie – In the premises in accordance with the guidelines of “Terrestrial Animal Health Code” OIE;	
	·	Q-fever - during the last 12 months in the premise or the premises are free after testing by PCR on tank milk;	
	·	rinderpest – during last 12 months in the EU Member State;	
	·	Foot-and-mouth disease, sheep pox and goat pox, peste des petits ruminants - during the last 12 months on the territory of the EU Member State;	
	·	Bluetongue – when animals are not vaccinated, during the last 24 months in the premise; or when vaccination is carried out against bluetongue in the premises, vaccination should be carried out not earlier than 6 months before shipment, or other period instructed by the vaccine manufacturer(2) (to indicate name of vaccine, date of vaccination and the period of immune protection);	
	·	Brucellosis, tuberculosis, during the last 3 years in the premise;	
·	Anthrax – during the last 20 days in the premise;		
II.1.2.	Free of the following contagious diseases:		
·	Maedi-Visna, pulmonary adenomatosis and caprine arthritis/encephalitis - during the last 3 years on the premise;		
·	Johne's disease and border disease - during the last 3 years in the premise;

II.3.	Animals have not been treated with natural or synthetic estrogens (excluding estrus synchronization), hormonal substances and thyreostatic preparations (excluding medical treatment for pre and post-partum disorders).		
II.4.	Animals have been in the place of origin since birth or not less than 6 months. The exported animals were kept for 21 days in quarantine under the supervision of the State/official Veterinarian and of the representative of Government Veterinary Service of the Russian Federation. The animals were healthy during this period and had no contacts with other animals, were tested in official laboratory by the methods, approved in the EU , with negative results (indicate the name of the laboratory, date and method of testing) for(3)
