	II.1. Horses exported into the Russian Federation are clinically healthy, are not vaccinated against equine encephalomyelitis of all types and African horse sickness and originate from premises and/or administrative territory, officially free from infectious diseases of animals, including:(1)		
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· African horse sickness - during the last 2 years in the territory of the EU;</li> <li>· Equine encephalomyelitis of all types - during the last 2 years in the territory of the EU Member State;</li> <li>· foot-and-mouth disease, vesicular stomatitis and glanders - during the last 6 months in the territory of the EU Member State;</li> <li>· dourine - during the last 6 months in the administrative territory of the EU Member State;</li> <li>· equine influenza, equine viral arteritis - during the last 6 months in the premises;</li> <li>· contagious equine metritis, equine infectious anaemia, equine rhinopneumonitis, rabies - during the last 3 months in the premises;</li> <li>· anthrax - during the last 20 days in the premises;</li> </ul>		
	II.2. Horses to be shipped to the Russian Federation were kept not less than for 21 days under supervision of an official veterinarian in the exporting country ( ). During this period each animal was subjected to clinical examination with daily thermometry, and the diagnostic tests were carried out in an official laboratory by the methods, approved in the EU Member State with negative results (indicate the name of the laboratory, date and method of testing) for:

	II.3. Before shipment the animals were vaccinated against equine influenza by inactivated vaccine.
