The breeding poultry and productive poultry described in this certificate, exported to the Republic of Moldova have remained on the territory of the EU Member States, for at least three month or since hatching where it is less than three month old. 2. The breeding poultry and productive poultry described in this certificate come from (a) zone(s) or a country in the EU which at the date of issue of this certificate was (were) free from: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) Newcastle disease as regulated by Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687; b) highly pathogenic avian influenza as regulated by Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687; 3. The breeding poultry and productive poultry described in this certificate come from an establishment in which no confirmed case of infection with low pathogenic avian influenza viruses has been reported for at least 21 days prior to the date of collection of the hatching eggs, from which breeding poultry and productive poultry have hatched, as similarly foreseen by the provisions laid down in Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/692. 4. They come from a flock where vaccination against avian influenza has not been carried out. 5. They have been kept at the establishment, defined in Box I.11 of Part I of this certificate, that is officially approved in accordance with Delegated Regulation 2019/2035 since hatching or for at least 6 weeks immediately prior export, and on the date of issue of the certificate mentioned the establishment fulfils the following requirements in accordance with Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/692: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) the approval of establishment has not been suspended or withdrawn; b) the establishment at the time of presence of the breeding and productive poultry, was (were) not subject to any animal health restriction imposed by the competent authority of the country of origin; c) within a 10 km radius of the establishment (including, where appropriate, the territory of a neighbouring country) there has been no outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza or Newcastle disease for at least the previous 30 days. 6. They come from flocks: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) which no more than 24 hours prior to loading have been examined by a veterinarian/official inspector, with the results indicating the absence of any signs of diseases to which poultry is susceptible. b) which fulfil the requirements of the Regulation (EC) No 2160/2003 on the control of salmonella. c) that: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) either have not been vaccinated against Newcastle disease.
