Additional health requirements for countries not free from Newcastle disease</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> [I, the undersigned official veterinarian, further certify that the breeding ratites from which the hatching eggs are derived:</p> <p>(a) were placed in isolation under official surveillance not less than 30 days prior to laying the hatching eggs for import to Great Britain;</p> <p>(b) underwent a virus isolation test for Newcastle disease, carried out in an official laboratory seven to 10 days after their entry into isolation on either cloacal swabs or faeces samples from each bird and in which no avian paramyxovirus type 1 isolates with an Intracerebral Pathogenicity Index (ICPI) of more than 0,4 were found.
